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Top ten well know theatres

1. Film Forum (New York, NY)

Focuses on classic, foreign, and indie films. Nearly 50 years in operation, curating screenings of works by masters like Charlie Chaplin and Jean-Luc Godard 1.

2. The Egyptian Theatre (Hollywood, CA)

Restored by Netflix; hosts art-house, noir retrospectives, and premieres. Historic 1922 venue with Egyptian Revival architecture and modern tech 1.

3. The Castro Theatre (San Francisco, CA)

Iconic 1922 Art Deco theater with a Wurlitzer organ and LGBTQ+ film events. Known for cult classics, sing-alongs, and international film festivals 1.

4. The Belcourt Theatre (Nashville, TN)

Nonprofit silent-era cinema showcasing indie, documentary, and foreign films. Features director Q&As and social advocacy programs 1.

5. Coral Gables Art Cinema (Miami, FL)

Nonprofit indie cinema with art deco design and curated international films. Supports independent filmmakers and offers a classic movie-going experience 1.

6. Sie FilmCenter (Denver, CO)

Hosts the Denver Film Festival and advance screenings of indie films. A hub for thought-provoking documentaries and festivals 1.

7. Michigan Theater (Ann Arbor, MI)

Historic 1928 theater with a mix of new releases, classics, and live performances. Stunning architecture and a vibrant cultural landmark 1.

8. Tampa Theatre (Tampa, FL)

1926 Mediterranean-style theater with a Mighty Wurlitzer organ. Features classic film series and community events in a breathtaking setting 1.

9. Stanford Theatre (Palo Alto, CA)

Specializes in classic Hollywood films from the 1920s–1960s. Fully restored 1925 venue with vintage projectors 1.

10. The Music Box Theatre (Chicago, IL)

1929 Spanish-style theater with midnight horror shows and indie films. Known for organ performances and

a vintage marquee 1.
