#flower #perennial *Passiflora incarnata* (Maypop): This is the hardiest species, surviving in USDA Zones 5-91. It can handle Ohio's winters well and will regrow each spring. *Passiflora caerulea* (Blue Passionflower): This species can survive winters in Zones 6-9, though it may need some protection in the coldest parts of Ohio23. It can die back in winter but often regrows from the roots. *Passiflora lutea* (Yellow Passionflower): While less common, this species can also survive in similar conditions to *P. caerulea*

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
