Black Walnut: Known for its rich flavor and dark wood¹. Butternut: Produces sweet, lemon-shaped nuts¹.

American Chestnut: Once abundant, this tree produces clusters of small, sweet nuts¹. Shellbark Hickory: Known for its large, sweet nuts¹. Shagbark Hickory: Produces sweet, edible nuts and has distinctive peeling bark¹. Pecan: Though challenging, pecans can be grown in Ohio with proper care¹. Hazelnut (Filbert): Produces small, sweet nuts and is relatively easy to grow¹. Beech: Produces small, triangular nuts that are edible¹. Chinese Chestnut: A hardy tree that produces sweet, edible nuts¹. Heartnut: A type of walnut with heart-shaped nuts¹. English Walnut (Carpathian): A hardy version of the common English walnut¹. Almond: Though not common, almonds can be grown in Ohio with the right conditions¹. Pine Nuts: From certain species of pine trees, these nuts are edible and nutritious¹. Ginkgo Nuts: From the Ginkgo biloba tree, these nuts are edible when cooked¹. [Acorns](#): From oak trees, acorns can be leached to remove tannins and then eaten
