Top Languages Spoken in Ohio (Approximate Numbers):

English

Over **90%** of Ohio's population speaks English as their primary language at home.

Spanish

- Approximately **2.5% to 3%** of Ohio's population (around **300,000 to 350,000 people**) speaks Spanish.

 - Middletown has a growing Hispanic population, with many Spanish-speaking residents of Mexican descent.
 - Springfield has a notable Hispanic community, with many Spanish speakers from Mexico and Puerto Rico.
 - Akron has a growing Hispanic population, particularly in neighborhoods like **North Hill** and **East Akron**.
 - Canton has a small but significant Hispanic community, with many Spanish speakers of Mexican and Puerto Rican descent.
 - Many of these communities have grown due to immigration from Mexico, Puerto Rico, and other Latin American countries, as well as internal migration within the U.S.
- Cultural centers, festivals (like Cleveland's **Hispanic Heritage Festival**), and businesses catering to Spanish-speaking populations are common in these areas.
1. **German**
 - Historically significant, but today, less than **1%** of the population (around **50,000 to 70,000 people**) speaks German.
 2. **Chinese (Mandarin, Cantonese, etc.)**
 - Around **0.5%** of the population (approximately **60,000 to 70,000 people**) speaks Chinese.
 3. **Arabic**
 - Roughly **0.4%** of the population (around **40,000 to 50,000 people**) speaks Arabic.
 4. **Hindi**
 - About **0.3%** of the population (around **30,000 to 40,000 people**) speaks Hindi.
 5. **French**
 - Approximately **0.2%** of the population (around **20,000 to 30,000 people**) speaks French.
 6. **Italian**
 - Around **0.2%** of the population (approximately **20,000 to 25,000 people**) speaks Italian.
 7. **Tagalog**
 - About **0.2%** of the population (around **20,000 to 25,000 people**) speaks Tagalog.
 8. **Russian**
 - Approximately **0.1% to 0.2%** of the population (around **15,000 to 20,000 people**) speaks Russian.
