Cuisine	What Columbus has
Nepali and Bhutanese	The largest expatriate Bhutanese-Nepali community in the world, as of 2018.
Somali	The second-largest Somali community in the United States, as of 2004.

Pizza	Columbus-style pizza is its own regional style — thin crust, provolone, sweet sauce, cut into rectangles.
